Item	Cost and/or Preparation
Aluminum Products	Free
Appliances - Freon Containing Products	Refrigerators and Freezers \$12.00 Air Conditioners/ Water Coolers \$15.00
Asphalt Shingles	\$35.00 per level pick up load-They are recycled
Ballasts	\$.58 per pound
Batteries	Rechargeable-\$.70-\$.80 per Pound; Alkaline-Free; Car/Truck-Free
Cardboard	Free
Computers	\$3.00 for the monitors; Businesses pay \$12.00 per monitor
Construction Debris	Wood \$15 per level pickup truckload Sheetrock \$25.00 per level pickup truckload
Fluorescent Light Bulbs	\$.25 per Linear foot for long bulbs; \$1.00 per compact lamp (See All Areas Section for options.)
Furniture	<i>Wooden Furniture</i> \$5.00 each or free if torn down and thrown into debris hopper <i>Couches</i> \$10.00 or free if torn down and different parts thrown into proper container; <i>Chairs</i> \$5.00 or free if torn down (i.e.; Wood frame into debris hopper; Material and cushions thrown into trash hopper; Metal frame thrown into metals hopper) <i>Box Spring and mattresses--Twin</i> \$3.00; Full and up \$5.00; Furniture is free if broken down and thrown into proper hoppers.
Needles and syringes only - from residents only	Free (NOTE: Has to be in a heavy plastic container such as a detergent bottle; please pack loose space with cotton or some other material and make a small puncture in the bottle so that air can escape when it's crushed.)
Lawn Mowers	Free (NOTE: Drain gas and oil)
Mercury containing products	Mercury containing product (e.g. thermometers) \$8.00 per pound (NOTE: Switches from chest freezers, gas hot water heaters and gas stoves) \$3.00
Metals – includes car parts and misc. motors	Free (NOTE: Smorgon Steel pays for the metal to remove it from the Transfer Station.)
Microwaves	Free
Mixed paper	Free: (NOTE: Includes light cardboard boxes such as cereal, cracker boxes, shoeboxes, foreign cardboard, pizza boxes, boxes that toys are sold in. Please remove the waxed paper or plastic liner from any container, then flatten.) Junk mail, office paper, egg cartons
Newspaper/magazines	Free
Paint (Latex or Oil Based)	Free (NOTE: either let it dry out or fill the can with kitty litter, sand or sawdust)
Plastic #1, 2, 3	Free (NOTE: rinse clean and remove any caps and rings)
Propane Tanks	Camp Tanks (20#) \$10.00 per tank, Tall tanks \$20.00 per tank (NOTE: Residents are to open the valves-the tanks are then stored at the Transfer Station.)
Televisions	\$3.00-\$5.00 depending on the size
Tires	Free up to 17" limit 12 per visit-no rims attached Tires > 17" need to be chopped up into quarters -PERC recycles them by removing the wires and chopping them up into pieces.
Transmissions and Car motors	Free (NOTE: Fluids need to be removed.)
Used Clothing	Free
Used Motor Oil	5 gallons per visit in containers no bigger than 2 gallons. (NOTE: Used in Town Garage furnaces. If it is discolored it is refused and becomes Hazardous Waste.)
Yard Waste	Free: leaves, grass clipping and garden waste. Branches and pine needle are disposed of as construction debris

All Recycled Items--Monthly Curbside Pickup/3rd Thursday of the Month

Item	Cost and Preparation
Household garbage	Weekly curbside, Thursday, put out by 7:00 a.m.
Cardboard	Cut into pieces no larger than 3 ft x 3 ft
Glass bottles & jars	Rinse and discard plastic or metal lids
Newspaper/magazines, catalogs/phone books	Bundled in brown paper bags
Plastic bottles - #2 only	Free
Tin and aluminum can	Rinse and put in recycling bin
Tires	Free-Limited to 2 tires, put out with regular household garbage
White goods	Free: Curbside annually

Household Metals – includes microwaves; VCRs, batteries, Freon containing units (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners)	Curb Side Pick Up (June 18, 2008) Check with town for future dates	Sponsored by Town – Freon units \$18 each – Fees must be paid ahead of time and receipts placed on goods
Universal Waste – includes small batteries; propane tanks (20 – 30 lbs); computer monitors & TVs; thermostats & ballasts; florescent bulbs; cans with paint	Verona Island Town Hall Check with town for date	Sponsored by Town some items may incur a fee
Empty paint cans	Weekly trash pick up	Sponsored by Town
Vehicle batteries and 2 tires	Weekly trash pick up	Sponsored by Town
Household Bulky Waste – includes couches, mattresses, chairs, tables, desks, shelves, rugs, carpets and pads. Pick-up truck and car tires limit 4 per household	Curb Side Pick Up – (June 25, 2008) Check with town for future dates	Sponsored by Town
